

IVFDF Archivists Report 2011

The website

Last year I undertook an amount of work to bring our systems up to date. These improvements were to cover the following areas.

- Improve the server hosting environment, to improve the sites up time, and survivability.
- Allow users to sign up for accounts on the archive so they can content.
- Bring the archive software up to-date so new media types (i.e. youtube) can be added to the archive.

A lot of work this year has gone into capitalizing on last year's changes. The archive now has 261 users, and over 100 new items have been added to the archive.

IVFDF Forum

At the request of the development officer a forum for IVFDF was setup and is now operational, however it has not as yet received any publicity thus is somewhat under used.

Festival Support

Web hosting

One of the rolls of the archivist is that of support for the current festival. For the current festival (Bristol 2011) the archive has provided web hosting services for their website. The advantages of archive providing hosting services are as follows.

Advantages to the festival

- Keeps costs to the festival down, as the service is provided at zero cost to the festival.
- Technical support where needed for getting the site up and running

Advantages to the archive

- Keeping pervious festivals websites archived was becoming increasingly difficult as the sites cease to use simple HTML. With the archive providing hosting keeping an archived copy of the festivals site is now much simpler and effective.
- It helps to build a relationship between the central committee and each festivals committee.

E-commerce and point of sale systems

Since 2008 most IVFDFs have been making use of an e-commerce and till system developed by Brian Quinion for Sheffield IVFDF 2008. This system handles the selling of tickets on-line, and provides the reception systems for selling tickets etc and collecting the tickets sold on-line. However this system did have some difficulties, the software needed to be deployed on dedicated server hardware which Brain had to take to each festival. This trespassed on Brian's time too much, as was not sustainable. However as the system makes dealing with tickets sales much more efficient, and it saves each years festival having to create their own ticket sales solution, the archive helped with getting the software working in a more portable manor. This means that this extremely useful software can now be preserved for each festival to use in a sustainable manor, which should allow Brian to step away from the project.

The audio documentary

As this is IVFDF's 60th year, a project has been setup to put together and audio documentary on IVFDF. The aim is to produce a 30min piece that covers IVFDF from it's early years to it's current format. The documentary should also give the

E-commerce and point of sale systems

The e-commerce/epos solution can certainly be improved going forward. As the system currently stands the on-line ticket sales requires some complex setup. This could be improved by re-developing the software as a plugin for an CMS system (e.g. wordpress). However for this work not to be wasted, IVFDF would have to look toward standardizing how each festival builds it's websites. We would need to commit each festival to using a common CMS.

Succession Planning

While I have no intention of stepping down as archivist in the foreseeable future I can't continue in roll forever. As the roll involves the maintenance of a number of technologically complex systems handover will be channeling, as a certain background knowledge and skill set would be required, as well as an amount of training on the details of the systems. We may need to look at introducing an overlap period or the idea of a deputy archivist.
